<p>Quality criteria 1: Number of credit units for lectures, practical sessions and self-learning are appropriate to the contents</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Evaluation</i> The number of credits (3 ECTS) for lectures, practical exercises and self-study is adequate. Indeed, the three main course topics give to students the necessary knowledge to tackle the course avoiding running into gaps that can cause delays in learning. <i>Strategies for improvement</i> No improvements are needed as long as the required.
<p>Quality criteria 2: Total number of credit units in the course is correct and appropriate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Evaluation</i> The overall workload pertinent to 3 ECTS is 104 hours (70 hours of independent work plus 34 hours in class activities). These numbers are appropriate as long as the students have a good knowledge in the required courses as stated in ‘Quality criteria 1’. <p><i>Strategies for improvement</i></p>
